Week #6: Navigating Weather

- Recorded Livestream: Live from Endurance22 with Carla Ramjukadh and Marc De Vos of the South African Weather Service (47 mins) — Tim joins Carla Ramjukadh and Marc De Vos from the South African Weather Service office aboard the ship, where they monitor the unpredictable weather conditions of the Weddell Sea!

Week #7: Finding Endurance

- Recorded Livestream: <u>Discovering Sir Ernest Shackleton's Endurance</u> (58 mins) Over a century after Sir Ernest Shackleton's ship sank, the Endurance22 crew found Endurance at a depth of 9,869 feet in the Weddell Sea. Watch Tim speaking with Endurance22 Director of Exploration Mensun Bound and AUV Supervisor Chad Bonin about sub-sea robotics and their search for Sir Ernest Shackleton's sunken Endurance.
